Minister May God our Father forgive us our sins, and bring us to the fellowship of his table with his saints for ever.All Amen.

A Reading: I will remember you

A reading from the Gospel according to Saint John.

The Act of Remembrance

The Paschal Candle, the great candle of Easter, is lit as a sign of the resurrection hope in Christ Jesus.

 Minister Almighty God we give you thanks because Christ our paschal sacrifice has made us children of the light, rising to new and everlasting life. He has opened the gates of heaven to receive his faithful people. His death is our ransom from death, his resurrection is our rising to life. The joy of the resurrection renews the whole world, while the choirs of heaven sing for ever to your glory.
