The Word of God

The Reading: Romans 14.7 - 12

A reading from the Letter to the Romans.

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life, it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.

The Act of Remembrance

The Paschal Candle, the great candle of Easter, is lit as a sign of the resurrection hope in Christ Jesus.

He has opened the gates of heaven to receive his faithful people. His death is our ransom from death, his resurrection is our rising to life. The joy of the resurrection renews the whole world, while the choirs of heaven sing for ever to your glory.

As 'The last journey' is sung you are invited to come to the front to have your candle lit from the Easter Candle.

Minister Hear us, O merciful Father, as we remember in love those whom we have placed in your hands. Acknowledge, we pray, the sheep of your own fold, lambs of your own flock, sinners of your own redeeming. Enfold them in the arms of your mercy, in the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and in the glorious company of the saints in light.
